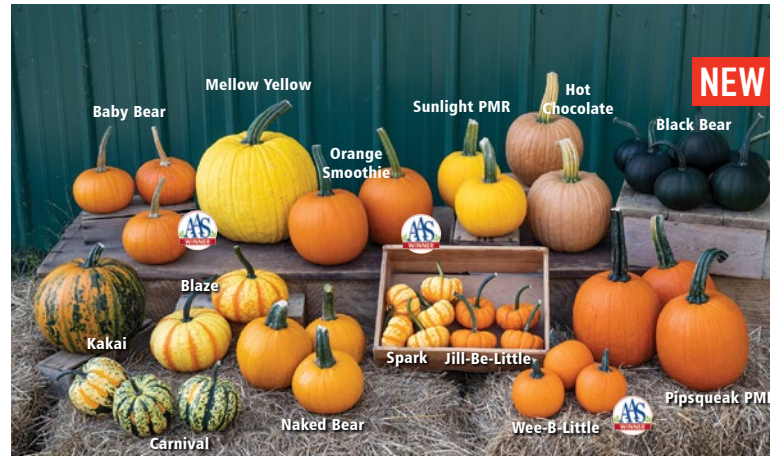

Blaze	3668T or 3668	<i>C. pepo</i>	95	IR: PM.	2½–3½ lb.	Semibush	Brilliant color. Very uniform with big yields.
Carnival	2452	<i>C. pepo</i>	95	—	1½ lb.	Semibush	Colorful decorative acorn.
Galeux d'Eysines	3777	<i>C. maxima</i>	95	—	15–20 lb.	Long	Peanut-like blisters on salmon-pink skin. A choice edible.

Rouge Vif D'Etampes	614	<i>C. maxima</i>	115	—	10–15 lb.	Long	Striking color and shape. Good for pies.
Scarface	4653	<i>C. pepo</i>	105	—	15–20 lb.	Long	Ghoulis, warty pumpkin.
Spark	3776	<i>C. pepo</i>	90	IR: PM.	½ lb.	Medium	Bright, striped mini pumpkin. Perfect for tabletop displays.
Speckled Hound	2506	<i>C. maxima</i>	100	—	3–6 lb.	Extra Long	A beautiful bicolor pumpkin that bakes up nicely.
Sunlight PMR	3910	<i>C. pepo</i>	100	IR: PM.	4–6 lb.	Medium	Unique yellow color draws attention at farmstands.
Turk's Turban	618	<i>C. maxima</i>	95	—	3–7 lb.	Long	Mushroom-shaped with multicolored skin.
