3765	Glass Gem	120	6-8"	10'	2,700	Translucent, rainbow-colored kernels.
Flour and Cornmeal						
4381G <b>CG</b>	Montana Morado Maize	85	8-10"	5-6'	1,600	Purple, almost black kernels from an early, drought- resistant corn adapted to harsh northern climates.
2161G <b>CG</b>	Painted Mountain	85	6-7"	4'	1,600	Hardy, multicolor ears. Decorative or for flour.
307	Oaxacan Green	95	6-10"	7'	1,600	Emerald green kernels for cornmeal & decoration.
311G <b>CG</b>	Nothstine Dent	100	7-8"	7'	1,200	Best flavor and color for cornmeal and flour.
2535G <b>CG</b>	Jerry Petersen Blue	105	7-8"	7'	1,600	Blue corn for blue flour & ornamental displays.
4469	Bloody Butcher	110	8-10"	11'	1,500	Medium-to-dark, blood red ears. Great for making red flour, cornmeal, and for roasting when fresh. Popular as a base for sour mash whiskey.

4228	Mixed Broom Corn	85-110	_	8-9'	20,000	Mix of red, gold, black & burgundy. Decorative. 10 stems/plant.
1586	Red Broom Corn	85-110	_	8-9'	20,700	Red seed heads for fresh, dried & broom making. 5 stems/plant.
