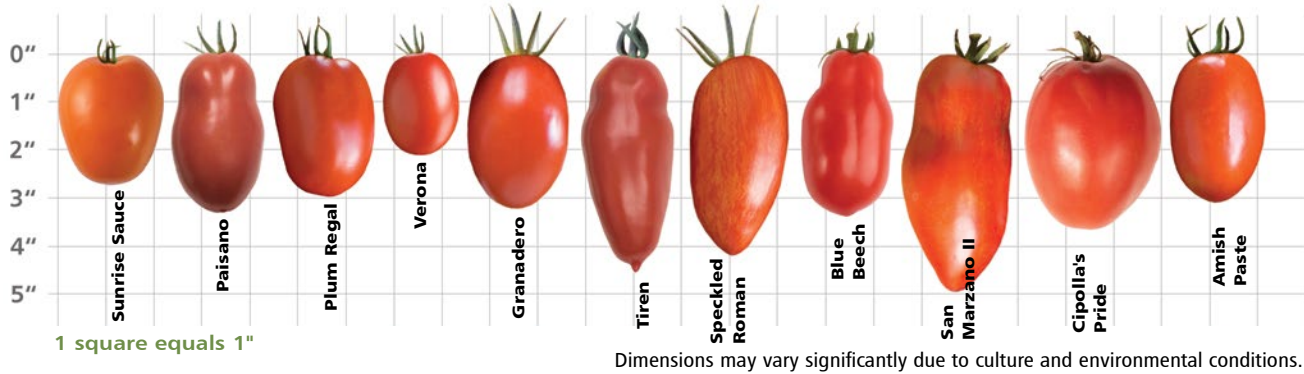

2584G OG	Granadero (F1)	Roma	75	4–5 oz.	HR: F (1, 2), TOMV, V. IR: N, PM, TSWV.	Organic, broad disease resistance
3998	Tiren (F1)	San Marzano	75	5–6 oz.	HR: F (1), TOMV, V.	Classic San Marzano flavor
3405G	San Marzano II	San Marzano	78	4–6 oz.	–	High-quality strain of this classic paste tomato.
3406G OG	Wisconsin 55	Heirloom San Marzano	80	4–6 oz.	–	OP paste tomato with classic old-world look and taste
