<b>Dinosaur Gourd</b>	4547	<i>Lagenaria siceraria</i>	125	3½ Lb.	36–48"	Lustrous green skin with distinct ridges for a reptilian appearance. Can be dried like a bottle gourd.
<b>Gremlins</b>	700	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	95	1–1¼ Lb.	36–48"	Large, colorful, warted collection in a multitude of shapes: stars, wings, acorns, mushrooms, necks, and more.
<b>Harrowsmith Select</b>	2226G <b>CG</b>	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	95	8–12 Oz.	18–24"	Mix of diverse shapes and bold fall colors. Developed by Jim Harvey.
<b>Hoargarth</b>	5035	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	90	3½–5 Lb.	36–48"	Eye-catching, warty orange fruit with "black" batwing patterning and whimsical twisted stems.
