

Twine Knotter Assembly & Use



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Materials Included

- (1) Twine Knotter Head
- (1) Wood Handle
- (1) #8 x 3/4" inch screw

Required For Assembly (Not Included)

Phillips-head Screwdriver



Assembling the Twine Knotter

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Slide Twine Knotter Head over Wood Handle. Tap lightly to make sure the Twine Knotter Head is completely on the handle.
- 2. Insert the #8 x 3/4" screw using a Phillips-head screwdriver.

OPERATION & USE

1. Position twine into slot. (Figure 1)





 Wrap twine clockwise around the post three times if you are using a natural fiber twine, six times if you are using synthetic twine. (Figure 2)

- Wrap the twine around the loop and back across existing twine and bring twine down and hold taught alongside the handle. (Figure 3)
- 4. Push the curved arm up firmly into your trellis wire or pipe (*Figure 4*) until the notch of the Twine Knotter is firmly against your trellis wire or pipe. (*Figure 5*)



 To release the knot at the end of the season, pull down the loose end of the twine located up near your trellis wire or pipe. (Figure 6)




